Use of computers or other appropriate tools are acceptable, provided the member completes the work; however, if the project focuses on the use of specific tools, higher-level tools cannot be substituted (i.e. use of power tools is not permitted in Woodworking, book 1 which deals only with hand tools). A project/exhibit created by utilizing technological aids will not receive additional credit or be discounted over comparable projects/exhibits created using traditional methods.

Record Book & Story (50 pts) _____

Consisting of the completed project record book, required signatures, story, demonstration, meeting requirements and related materials that are not a part of the member's exhibit).

(Is it complete, interesting, appropriate for the member's age and skill level, is the project experience described)

Educational value and/or project skills demonstrated, member's age and skill level to be considered; accuracy of information and easy to understand. Poster lettering readable from 10 feet.
