Brett Kaysen

Animal Science Instructor and student advisor, at Colorado State University – Fort Collins, Colorado. He received his Master's and Bachelor's degrees from Colorado State University.

Brett grew up on a small swine operation in eastern Colorado where he was involved in 4-H and FFA. He has coached the Colorado State judging team for five years, winning the National contest in 2002. His teams have won the contest at the Arizona National four times, and also won at Houston, Fort Worth and Denver. He was also a member of the National Champion Colorado State University Livestock Judging Team.

He has judged county and state fairs in 20 different states. Some of his judging experiences include the Junior Simmental Show at the National Western Stock Show, breeding gilts at the Houston Stock Show, market barrows at the Fort Worth Stock Show and the Crossbred Classic and swine showmanship at the Indiana State Fair. Brett also served as an official judge at the 2002 National Swine Symposium in Oklahoma. He was also involved in the 2004 National Market Hog Conference. Brett has been involved in the Intermountain Judges' Training since 2004 and is a key swine industry leader.

Paul Kuber

Dr. Paul Kuber is an assistant professor in Animal Science at the Ohio State University. His primary responsibilities include Youth Livestock Extension Specialist for 4-H, in addition to teaching and research in the area of meat science. Paul grew up in California and was a member of the Lassen Community College Livestock Judging team, California State University of Fresno Livestock Judging Team as well as the Market Animal Evaluation team. In addition to his participation as a team member, Paul coached the Market Animal Evaluation team for both Fresno State and the University of Nebraska and served a 2 year period at Nebraska as the Meats Judging coach. Paul completed his Ph.D. in Animal Science/Meat Science at Washington State University in 2001.

Paul grew up around sheep and has judged, county, state, regional and national shows in market, breeding, and jackpot shows. He has also judged meat goat shows at the state, regional and national level. Paul has extensive experience in the lamb industry. He has worked in the commercial packing industry in the United States and Australia, which has given him a clear understanding of the type of lambs that will produce the highest quality carcass. With his background in sheep, goats and meats along with his Youth Livestock assignment, Paul will be a tremendous asset to the 2009 Intermountain Livestock Judges' Training.
