

Housing

- ◆ The median sale price of a residential property in Sandpoint was \$245,000. (Selkirk Association of Realtors and Multiple Listing Service, 2006.)
- ◆ Bonner County housing costs have fluctuated between 4th and 7th highest in the state over the past 8 years.
- ◆ The number of housing units increased by 29.7% from 1990 to 2000 and 1% from 2000 to 2006. (NW Area Foundation).

Health Indicators

According to the Census Bureau, a person is considered uninsured if they are NOT covered by any type of health insurance for the entire year.

In Bonner County:

- ◆ In 2005, 17% of the population had no health insurance coverage.
- ◆ 16% of children under age 18 had no health insurance coverage compared to 15% of all Idaho children.

Prenatal Care in Bonner County:

- ◆ In 2006, 6.8% of women received late prenatal care (starting in the third trimester). This compares with 5.8% in Idaho as a whole.
- ◆ In 2006, 28 women received late or no prenatal care, compared to 17 in 1998.

Note: The Consumer Price Index (CPI) is a measure of inflation. Using the CPI to put dollar values in “real” terms makes it easier to see “inflation-free” change over time. Our base year is 2005, which means all dollar values are in terms of 2005 dollars. For more information, see <http://www.bls.gov/cpi/home.htm>

Hispanic Population

- ◆ The proportion of Hispanic residents grew from 1.0% in 1980 to 1.3% in 1990, to 1.9% in 2005, and 2.3% in 2007.

Age Structure

- ◆ 21.6% of Bonner County’s population was under 18 in 2007 in contrast to 27.2% in Idaho.
- ◆ In 2007, 64.5% of the population was 18 to 64 years old, compared to 61.1% in Idaho; 13.9% were over 65 compared to 11.7% in Idaho.

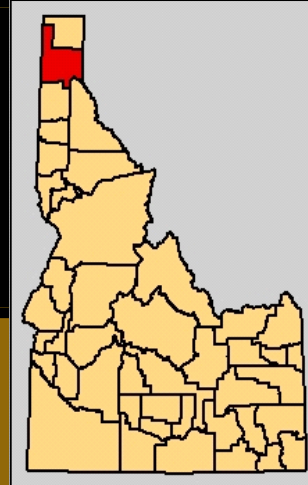
Median age is the age at which half the population is younger and half is older. A lower median age indicates a relatively young population, while a higher median age indicates a relatively older population.

The Median Age in Bonner County:

- ◆ Was 42.8 in 2007, 30.9 in 1980, 36.3 in 1990, and 40.8 in 2000.
- ◆ Ranked 10th from highest out of Idaho’s 44 counties in 2006.

HIGHLIGHTS

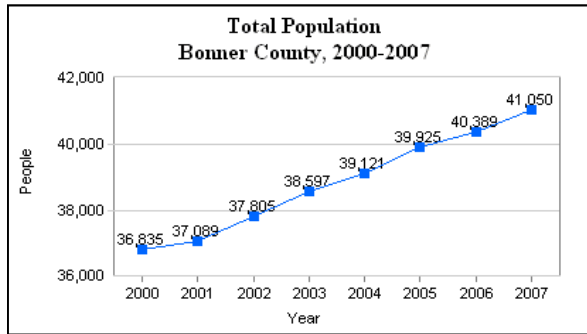
- ◆ Bonner County’s population in 2007 was 41,050.
- ◆ Bonner County added 4,215 residents between 2000 and 2007.
- ◆ Bonner County’s unemployment rate in December 2008 was 7.7%. In December 2007, the unemployment rate was 3.3%.
- ◆ The self-employment rate in Bonner County is 17%.
- ◆ Nearly 10% of Bonner County is covered by water.

Population Change

Bonner County:

- ◆ Gained 4,215 residents between 2000 and 2007.
- ◆ Grew by 11.4% between 2000-2007 compared to an increase of 15.9% in Idaho as a whole.
- ◆ Was the 12th fastest growing county out of Idaho's 44 counties.



Net migration, or the difference between how many people moved in and how many people moved out, is one part of population change. The other part is natural change, or the difference between births and deaths.

From 2000 to 2007, Bonner County:

- ◆ Had a net migration rate of 10.5% compared to 9.1% for Idaho.
- ◆ Grew by 474 residents due to natural change.
- ◆ Had a natural change rate of 1.3% compared to 6.8% for Idaho.

Employment

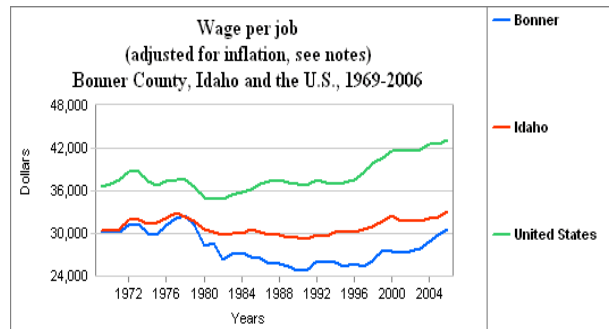
- ◆ Note: information on number of jobs does NOT reflect current recession.
- ◆ The number of jobs was 24,744 in 2006.

Wage per Job

- ◆ In Bonner County, the average wage per job was \$30,590 in 2006. (Adjusted for inflation).

Social Trends

Educational Attainment

- ◆ In 2000, 14.4% of the population 25 years and older had no high school diploma, compared to 15.3% in Idaho.
- ◆ In 2000, 16.9% of residents had a bachelor's degree or higher, compared to 21.7% in Idaho and 24.4% in the US.

Poverty in Bonner County:

- ◆ The overall poverty rate was 14.7% in 2007, compared to 12.2% in Idaho.
- ◆ The poverty rate for people under age 18 was 20.6% in 2007. The rate for children under five was 26.4%, and ranked 4th from highest of the 44 counties.
- ◆ The poverty rate for people 65 and over was 10.2% in 1999 and ranked 15th from highest of the 44 counties.

Bonner County Youth

- ◆ The teen birth rate in 2006 was 9 per 1,000, compared to 18 per 1,000 in Idaho.
- ◆ In 2000, 11.3% of teens age 16-19 were not working, looking for work, or in school, compared to 7.8% in Idaho.

Crime and Law Enforcement

- ◆ The number of crimes reported in 2007 was 213 per 10,000 population, compared to 249 in Idaho. The rate decreased by 21% between 2000 and 2007.
- ◆ In 2007, the number of sworn police officers was 1.7 per 1,000 population, compared to 1.8 per 1,000 in Idaho.
