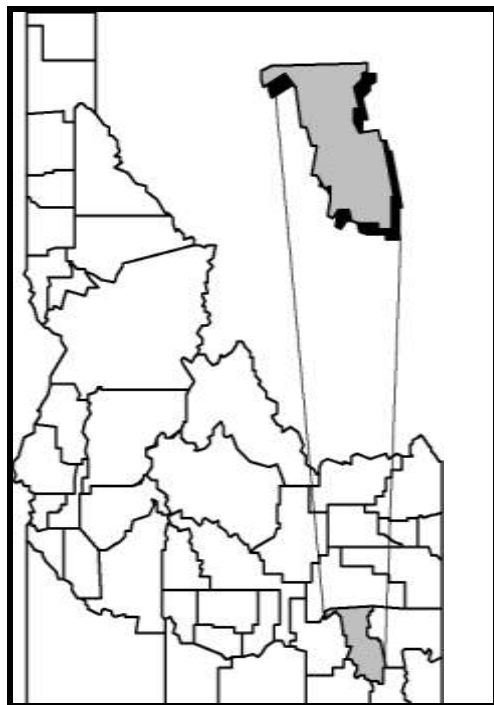

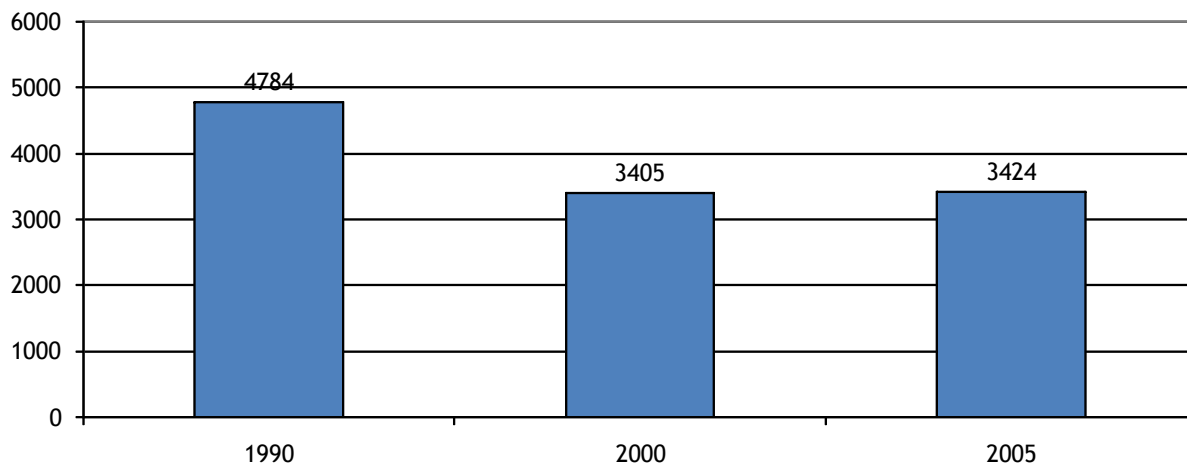

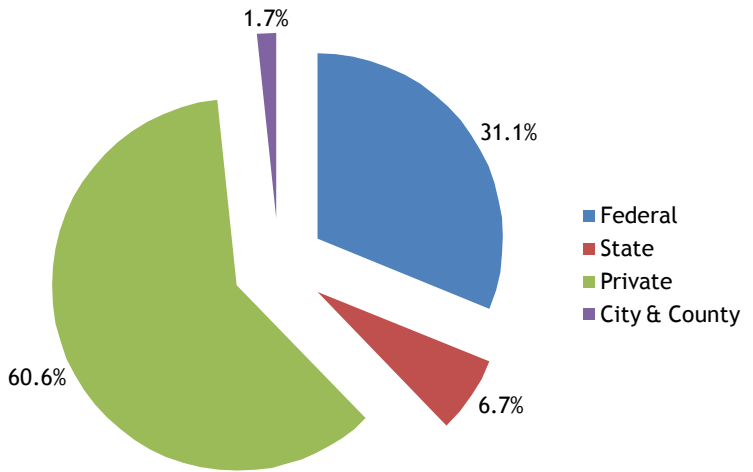

Bannock County is located in southeastern Idaho. It ranks 5th among Idaho counties in population and 27th in area. About 3 percent, or 34.3 square miles, of the county is covered by water. The federal government owns about 31 percent of the county. The local economy is diversified and forms the regional trading center for southeastern Idaho. Annual average total civilian employment grew 17.4 percent from 1996 to 2006. Major employers include Idaho State University, Union Pacific Railroad, AMI Semiconductor Inc., Varsity Contractors, Portneuf Medical Center, Convergys Customer Support Center, Farm Bureau Insurance Company, Farmers Insurance, Heinz Frozen Foods and Qwest Communications.

Bannock County is home to Idaho State University, the Idaho Museum of Natural History, and Pebble Creek Ski Area. The city of Lava Hot Springs, on the banks of the Portneuf River, offers a variety of geothermally heated pools for year-round swimming and soaking.
