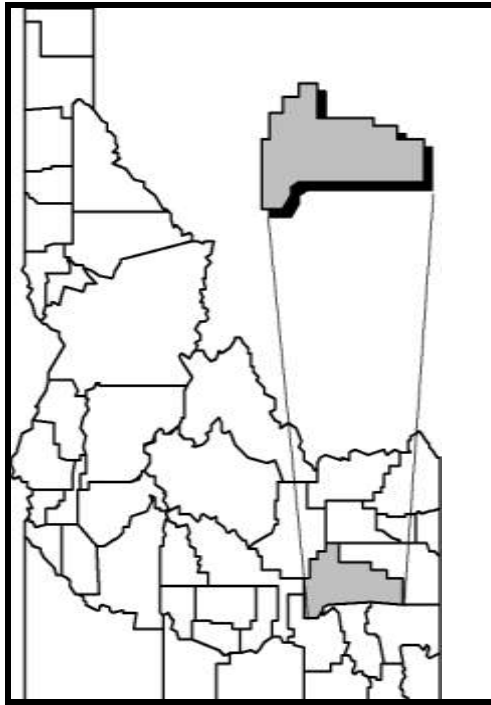

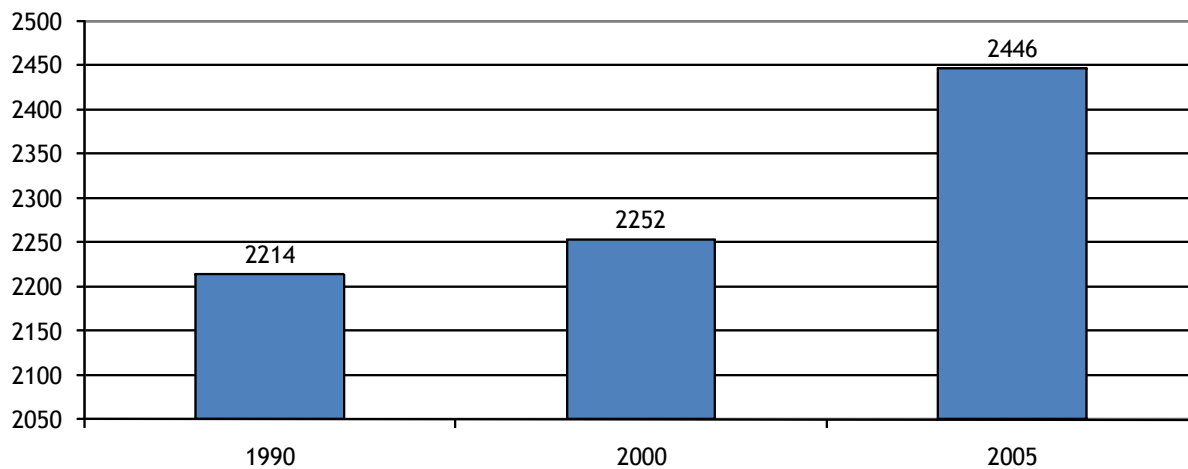

## Crime - Rate per 100,000



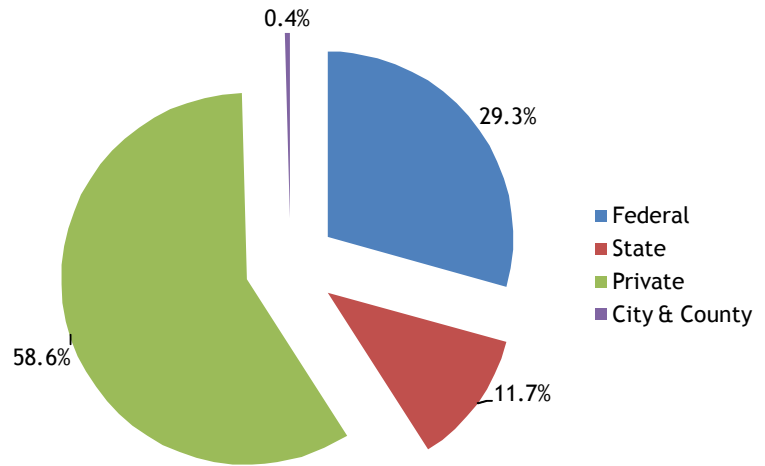

Bingham County is located in southeastern Idaho. It ranks 7th among Idaho counties in population and 12th in area. The federal government owns over 29 percent of the county. Agriculture and food processing are the basic industries and services, trade, and government provide major employment. Annual average total civilian employment grew 1.0 percent from 1996 to 2006. Major employers include Basic American Foods, Nonpareil Corporation, Idaho Supreme Potatoes, Inc., State Hospital South, Bingham Memorial Hospital, J.R. Simplot Company, Sho-Ban Gaming, Spudnik Equipment Company, Wal-Mart, and Wada Farms, Inc.

Bingham County is home to the Fort Hall Indian Reservation. The Idaho Potato Exposition has exhibits outlining the history of potato production in the state.
