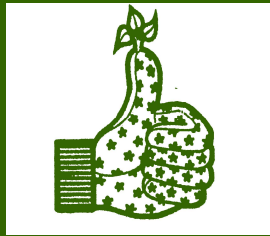

*Who are we?
What do we do?*

- The Master Gardener Program was established in 1972 by an Extension Agent who came up with the idea of trading specialized training in horticulture for a commitment to spend a specified number of hours doing volunteer outreach work.
- Training is research-based and presented by professionals and experts, and includes hands-on training. Class topics include soils, entomology, organic gardening, weeds, pests, pruning, composting, and much more.

- For Master Gardener Certification, the Latah County Program requires completion of the educational and training workshops and 40 hours of volunteer service to the community in the first year, through staffing of the Plant Clinics at the Extension Office and the Moscow Farmer's Market, working in community gardens and other Extension-approved educational activities.
- Master Gardener Volunteers research and answer questions in person and over the telephone about vegetable gardening, fruit trees, ornamentals, lawns, insects, weeds and other related home-horticultural topics with the support of the Extension staff. Volunteers are responsible for reporting their hours for certification.
